The Meeting will be under the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations, the /Championship Regulations of the Series/Championships (if applicable) in the list below and any written instructions issued for the event by the Organisers. All timings will be confirmed in Final Instructions.

For the purposes of this event the FIA Regulations comprising the International Sporting Code and the 2024 GB3 Championship Sporting and Technical Regulations have primacy over the National Competition Rules ('NCR') of the ASN. Therefore, any conflict including in these Supplementary Regulations between the FIA Regulations and the NCR shall be decided by the primacy of the FIA Regulations.

12. Eligible Cars, Competitors and Entries

13. Eligible Vehicles

Eligible Competitors are those Competitors and drivers accepted by the Championship to participate and always in accordance with the FIA Regulations.

All vehicles must comply with the Championship Technical Regulations at all times.

14. Judges

Judges of Fact will be published in an official bulletin.

15. Entries

Entries including entry fees shall be made in accordance with the FIA Regulations.

Entry fees and passes issued will be in accordance with the FIA Regulations, where applicable or according to the entry forms. All personnel and vehicle passes will identify the Competitor Entrant to which they are issued, and are issued on the condition that they are strictly not for resale or assignment. All passes remain the property of the Championship/MSV/MSVR as applicable. Failure to comply with the above will be considered a breach of these Regulations and the conditions of admission of the Event. Only personnel and vehicles with the relevant passes will be admitted to the Venue including the Paddock. No private cars will be allowed in the Paddock unless specifically authorised.

Entrants or their accredited representatives will be responsible for all persons concerned with their entry complying with these Regulations.

The number of starters permitted to start each race will be in accordance with the FIA Regulations and the track licence.

16. Signing On

Competitor signing on will take place at the time/location specified in art. 4 above.

17. Driver Changes

Any application for change of driver or vehicle must be made in writing to the Event Secretary, in accordance with the FIA Regulations.

18. Scrutineering

All vehicles must comply with FIA Regulations

All Competitor Entrants must present their cars for scrutineering (if so required) at the place and times indicated in the Final Instructions. All cars must be available for inspection in a race ready state. No car may practice or race unless approved by the Scrutineers. Drivers must present racewear conforming to the FIA Regulations for inspection at this time. Entrants and Drivers must be present at scrutineering and sign the necessary indemnities and/or documentation.

Drivers must wear crash helmets and clothing as specified by FIA/ASN Regulations during all practice sessions and races. These items must be available for scrutineering with the car or presented on demand of the Officials of the Meeting.

Race numbers on cars must comply with the FIA Regulations.

19. Timing

All Competitors are required to use transponders in accordance with the FIA Regulations.

20. Qualification, Starts and Pitlane

Unless provided otherwise by the FIA Regulations all drivers should complete a minimum of 3 laps and record a time in the appropriate session in accordance with the FIA Regulations to qualify.

Subject to the FIA Regulations the Stewards of the Meeting may provide written permission to start to drivers of cars who have not reached the qualification minima, providing this permission does not eliminate drivers who have qualified to start.

Grid positions will be set in accordance with the Championship Regulations.

Grid formations and start procedures will be in accordance with the FIA Regulations.

Judges of Fact will be appointed to determine false starts.

Unless otherwise advised in Final Instructions or by Bulletin the mandatory speed limit of 60 kph will apply in the Pit Lane for all practice sessions and races.

The Organisers may issue with the Final Instructions, specific Pit and Paddock Instructions which will have the same force as these Regulations and shall be part of the Official Documents of the Event.

21. Penalties

The Stewards may impose penalties in accordance with Championship Sporting Regulations.

22. Awards

Prizes and awards will be in accordance with Championship Sporting Regulations.

23. Finish

The end of the practice sessions or end of race signal will be given at the finish line when the leading car completes the scheduled race distance or duration or any amended session or race distance.

After taking the chequered flag at the end of the practice sessions and races, competitors must exit the Circuit in accordance with instructions which will be issued with the Final Instructions.

24. Parc Fermé

In addition to any Parc Fermé required for this Championship, the Organisers may at their discretion specify as many Parc Fermé as may be deemed necessary for the proper conduct of the Event.

25. Results

Provisional results will be published in accordance with the FIA Regulations as soon as possible after each race or at the end of the Event and will be available from Race Administration or on the Championship Official Noticeboards (which may be virtual). Provisional results will be published on the Official Notice Boards (which may be virtual).

26. Competitors' Instructions, Briefings, Protest and Appeals

Any additional instructions published by the Organisers will be deemed to have the same authority as these Regulations. Such additional instructions will be issued to Competitors as official bulletins and displayed on the Official Notice Boards.

Failure to attend the mandatory briefings for specific races may result in penalties in accordance with the FIA and/or Championship Regulations.

The procedure for protests and appeals is in accordance with the FIA Regulations.

27. TV / Filming / Video

Should Filming of the event be advised in the Final Instructions then the FIA Regulations will apply. Video equipment must not be fitted to any vehicle without express permission from the Championship Organisers. Any Competitor transgressing this regulation may be penalised. Once permission has been obtained (if applicable) video equipment must be fitted to the vehicle prior to scrutiny and the scrutineer must be advised.

28. Championship Points

In accordance with the Championship Regulations.

29. Important Notices to All Competitors

- a) The Organisers reserve the right to form grids if practice periods are disrupted by adverse weather conditions. In such circumstances the Decision of the Stewards will be notified to Competitors by the way of Bulletins.
- b) The below provisions, (i) & (ii), will apply subject to the FIA and/or Championship Regulations:
 - (i) The Stewards reserve the right to delete any lap time set in qualifying on a lap when track limits are reported to have been exceeded.
 - (ii) Any Driver unable to start the Green Flag/Pace Lap or unable to start is required to indicate their situation as per the FIA Regulations and any drivers unable to maintain grid positions on the Green Flag Lap to the extent that ALL other cars are ahead of them may complete the Green Flag Lap but MUST remain at the rear of the last row of the grid but ahead of any cars to be started with a time delay.
- c) All competitors are reminded that except while on the course or in the pitlane during an official session, no Competition Vehicle may be driver at a speed exceeding 10mph without the specific approval of the Race Director or Clerk of the Course. Vehicles must not be test-run on any of the venue roadways.
- d) Pit Lane – Competitors must not exit the Pit Lane when the Red Light at the pit exit is illuminated.
- e) No child or young person below the age at which a driving licence may legally be issued, may ride a motorcycle of any type within the venue including the paddock at any time.
- f) No pegs or stakes may be put into the Paddock Tarmac or concrete surface. No painting or decaling of Pit Garage floors, walls or doors may be undertaken without the prior permission of the Organisers.
- g) The Organisers may lead cars to the grid, from the Assembly Area, behind the Safety/Course Car to get grids formed up while the circuit may be partially blocked. In such circumstances Competitors must be aware of and safely negotiate any partial blockage of the track.
- h) Should any race generate more than one red flag the Organisers reserve the right to reschedule it within the Timetable of the Event.
- i) A fine may be applied to any Competitor that fails to clear the nominated areas in the times allotted.
- j) Please see Appendix A for Health and Safety information and other circuit notices.
